Who we are? —

United Way of Amarillo & Canyon is dedicated to improving the lives of individuals and families in our community. We focus on health, education, financial stability, basic needs, and youth. Who we help? -

ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed-individuals and families who work hard but struggle to afford basic needs. ALICE+ includes those who fall below the poverty line. Together, they represent the 45% of our community facing real financial hardship. We believe whether they fall within ALICE or ALICE+-and we are committed to funding programs that help break down the barriers they face every day.

Where \$ goes? -

98% of the dollars we raise stay local, directly supporting programs in our community. The remaining 2% covers dues that give us access to our name and helpful resources. Funding decisions aren't made by our board or staff-they're made by the Allocations Council, a group of local volunteers who anonymously review nonprofit applications and decide where funds are most needed. Anyone can join and help make a difference.

Why us?—

ALICE+ (see above for reference) are at the heart of our mission. We invest in research to truly understand their struggles, then fund and align impact-driven programs that offer real, lasting support.

What sets us apart? We don't just respond to need-we identify the gaps, raise the dollars, and fuel solutions that help people move from surviving to thriving. When you give to us, you're investing in proven change.
